NARRATIVE (See Accompanying Survey Plat)

The purpose of this survey was to establish a new common boundary between the State of Oregon and the Charles J. Liming and John T. Ulmer Porperty, Deed Book 278, Page 926, Till amook County, Oregon in the NE 1/4, NE 1/4 Section 25, T1S, R11W, W.M.

The bearings were based on C.S. #A-4556 by C. Wayne Cook by co-ordinating around Cook's plat and calculating the inverse between two monuments found on our survey.

Control was established using a "Jena" one-minute theodolite and a McHenry "Mac-IIH" electronic distance measuring instrument.

The parks survey crew comprised of R. LeTourneau, R. Hemmer and D. Polly set 5/8"x30" Iron rods with yellow plastic caps marked "OREGON STAE PARKS" and 7' fiberglass posts with decals marked "PROPERTY BOUNDARY STATE PARK LAND BEHIND THIS SIGN". At the two angle points of the common boundary located on the top of Maxwell point. The most northerly of these points was a reset of a Cook monument which was found lying on the ground.
