RESTORED CORNERS FOR OREGON STATE BOARD OF FORESTRY
 North one-sixteenth corner common to Sections 28
 and 29, T3S, R9W, W.M., Tillamook County, Oregon.

Post (found in place, scribes 1/16 remaining) from which a:

10" Fir bears $34^{\circ}15'W$ 46.1 Ft.; found in place, now 38" stump.

28" Fir bears $N10^{\circ}W$ 89.0 ft.; scribed N 1/16 S29 BT RE2311.

 $N23\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}W$ 6.1 ft.

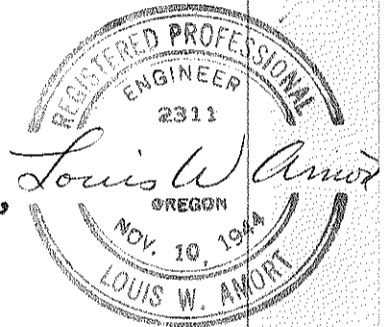

 ground, and from which a:

10" Spruce bears $S86^{\circ}W$ 66.3 ft.; scribed 1/4 S20 BT.

17" Alder bears $N18\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}E$ 19.4 ft.; scribed 1/4 S21 BT RE2311.

Oregon State Board of Forestry metal location poster on 17" BT.

Set 4" x 4" x 72" white painted Cedar post 1 ft. SW of corner pipe.
