General Description

North Spit in section 1 lies between the Pacific Ocean and Nestucca Bay about two miles south of Pacific City, Oregon. The area is covered with shifting sand with the main topographic feature being a low sand ridge along the ocean shore of the spit. Another outstanding feature is the Nestucca Bar at the south end of the spit, it is approximately one-quarter mile wide, with a channel approximately ten chains wide and 15 feet deep. Elevation ranges from sea level to about 30 feet above sea level.

There are no roads on North Spit; access is gained by boat from Nestucca Bay or on land from Kiwanda Beach at Pacific City. No cultural improvements were noted except for a United States Coast Guard telephone line crossing the area along the ocean beach. The surrounding area is noted for its excellent fishing and beach activities.

No evidence of mineral deposits were noted. The mean of several readings gives a magnetic declination of 20° 07' East.
