

Dependent Resurvey of Base Line, Portion of S. Bdy. of T. 1 N., R. 9 W.

Chains 27.70	Abandoned logging road, 15 lks. wide, bears N. and S.; leave reproduction and enter open logged area.
30.90	Branch, 1 lk. wide, course S. 10° W.; ascend 115 ft. over steep SE. slope.
34.33	Point for the closing corner of Sections 2 and 3, on the N. bdy. of T. 1 S., R. 9 W., hereinafter described. Ascend 3 ft. along S. slope.
34.70	Spur, slopes S.; descend 67 ft. over SW. slope.
36.67	The corner of Sections 34 and 35 only, determined at record distance on the slope from the remaining bearing trees marked by Meldrum: A hollow sawed hemlock stump, 40 ins. diam., bears N. 85° E., 60½ lks. dist., with no scribe marks remaining under old blaze scar. (Record N. 81° E., 74 lks. dist.). A hollow sawed hemlock stump, 36 ins. diam., bears S. 50° E., 48 lks. dist., with no scribe marks remaining under old blaze scar. (Record bearing S. 57° E., 48 lks. dist.). A rotten stump hole, about 2 ft. diam., bears S. 65° W., 50½ lks. dist., with no marks remaining. (Record S. 71° W., 54 lks. dist.). At the corner point Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mtd. <div style="text-align: center;"> T 1 N R 9 W S 34 S 35 S 3 T 1 S R 9 W 1959 </div> from which new bearing trees: A sawed fir stump, 72 ins. diam., bears N. 74° E., 205 lks. dist., mtd. TIN R9W S35 BT. A hemlock, 10 ins. diam., bears N. 48° W., 117 lks. dist., mtd. TIN R9W S34 BT. The corner falls under a spruce log, 30 ins. diam., in a wet ravine draining SW. Land, mountainous. Soil, rocky clay with numerous rock outcroppings. Timber, hemlock, fir, spruce, and cedar, deadened by fire except along the creeks; W. half logged; undergrowth, vine maple, devil's-club, salmonberry, young alder, and reproduction.
	N. 89° 11' W., along the S. bdy. of Section 34. Descend 80 ft. over SW. slope, through open logged area.
2.10	Branch, 1 lk. wide, course S.; ascend 385 ft. over steep SE. slope.
3.95	Abandoned logging road, 15 lks. wide, bears N. and S.
8.30	Spur, slopes S. 10° E.; descend 113 ft. over gradual SW. slope of benchland.
