	The corner falls alongside a snag, 20 ins. diam., bears N. 55° E., 6 lks. dist.										
	Descend 400 ft. along broken E. slope, changing to steep NE. slope.										
92.20	Top of rock bluff, 100 ft. high, edge bears E. and W.

	A fir, 30 ins. diam., bears S. 50° W., 74½ lks. dist., mkd. T1S R9W S2 CC BT.										
	From this point the corner of secs. 35 and 36 only, on the S. bdy. of T. 1 N., R. 9 W., bears S. 87° 17' W., 3.60 chs. dist., previously described.										
	Land, mountainous. Soil, rocky clay with rock outcroppings. Timber, hemlock, fir, spruce, alder, and cedar, deadened by fire except for the S. ¼ mile; undergrowth salmonberry, vine maple, devil's club, huckleberry, young alder, and reproduction.
