

A 12" Fir bears S28°W, 23.8 feet to face Scribed N 1/4 S 1 BT 650.

A 2" iron pipe of unknown origin bears East 6 feet. I removed.

The position for the original 1/4 corner to Section 36 as established by Henry Meldrum. This is now an angle point on the true Township Line, which is a square wood post. I replaced this with a 21 x 30" iron post with brass cap marked



from which

An old Fir stub bears N21°E, 32 lks to face No scribing visible but there is an old face. An old Fir stub bears S61°E, 44 lks to center This is an original BT--no scribing visible. A 29" Fir bears N20°W, 1.2 feet to face Face healed. A 22" Fir bears S57°E, 15.2 feet to face Scribed 1/4S 1 BT-Bark scribed 650 above face.

The true S 1/4 corner to Section 36 as established by Caudle bears \$23°35'58"W, 172.45 feet. At this point, I found a 1/2" iron pipe alongside the original stone with 1/4 still visible. I replaced with a $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x 30" iron post with brass cap marked

A 48" Fir bears N64°E, 36.5 feet slope distance to face Scribing just visible.

A 54" Fir bears S64°E, 18.5 feet to face Scribed 1/4 BT—Bark scribed 650 above face.
