Fork of Gold Creek 10 lks. wide runs N 75° W

Ascend 60 ft. to:

Set a Basalt stone 16x12x10 ins. 10 ins. in the ground for corner to Sections 4, 5, 32 and 33, marked with 4 notches on E and 2 on W edges

A Hemlock 14 ins. diam. bears N 37° W 43 lks. dist., Marked T 1 S R 8 W S-32 BT

A Hemlock 30 ins. diam. bears N 38° E 37 lks. dist., Marked T 1 S R 8 W S-33 BT

A Hemlock 18 ins. diam. bears S 32° E 41 lks. dist., Marked T 2 S R 8 W S-4 BT

A dead Hemlock 16 ins. diam. bears S 35° W 12 lks. dist., Marked T 2 S R 8 W S-5 BT

Land: mountainous, soil 2nd and 3rd rates

Heavily covered with forests of Fir, Hemlock, and Cedar, mostly deadened by fires.

Thick undergrowth of V. Maple, salmonberry, hemlock and alder 80 chains.
