

RESTORED CORNER FOR STATE OF OREGON - DEPARTMENT OF FORESTRY

Section corner common to Sections 1, 2, 11 and 12, T2N, R8W, W.M., Tillamook County, Oregon.

ORIGINAL By Henry Meldrum, August 4, 1893.

15"x10"x8" basalt stone 10" in ground with 5 notches on South and 1 notch on East; in place, upper notch on South side broken off.

- 48" Hemlock bears N44°E 63 lks.; missing.
- 40" Hemlock bears S50°E 25 lks.; missing.
- 16" Hemlock bears S34°W 30 lks.; missing.
- 7" Hemlock bears N26°W 27 lks.; now a 20"x3 ft. high badly rotted stub, no scribing visible.

RESTORATION by Louis W. Amort, RE2311, September 1, 1955 (Book 1, page 245, Tillamook County Records).

Erected mound of stone around corner stone; in place.

- 60" Fir stump bears S54 1/2°E 65.4 ft.; now 60", with scribes T2n R8W S12 BT visible.
- 66" Fir stump bears N71°E 62.2 ft.; now 66", with scribes T2N R8W S1 BT visible.
- 46" Fir stump bears N12 1/2°W 80.4 ft.; now 46", with scribes T2N R8W S2 BT RE2311 visible.
- 72" Fir snag bears S65°W 89.5 ft.; now a 56" stump with scribes T2N R8W S11 BT visible.

RESTORED December 2, 1987

Var 21 1/2°E

Set a 1 1/2"x30" Aluminum pipe with 3 3/4" cap marked "STATE OF OREGON DEPARTMENT OF FORESTRY T2N R8W S2 S1 S11 S12 1987 LS1998", 28 inches in ground, in mound of rock. Placed original stone alongside, from which a:

- 10" Fir bears S17°E 18.9 ft. to face; scribed T2NR8WS12BT.
- 18" Fir bears S58°W 21.2 ft. to face; scribed T2NR8WS11BT.
- 14" Fir bears N65°W 31.5 ft. to face; scribed T2NR8WS2BT.
- 13" Fir bears N18°E 10.4 ft. to face; scribed T2NR8WS1BT.

Metal location poster on new BTs.

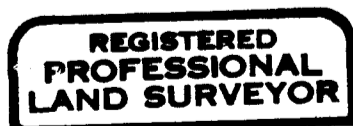
Also poster on 60" Fir stump BT S54 1/2°E 65.4 ft.

3/4" brass washer marked "LS1998" nailed to face of new BTs.

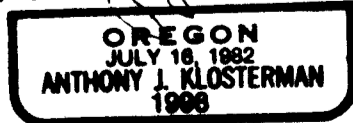
3"x4"x72" white painted Cedar post S38°W 3.6 ft.
