MEETING INFORMATION AND RULES

- Matters for discussion and consideration by the board shall be placed on an agenda prepared by the staff and approved by the board chair. Any commissioner may request items on the agenda.
- Public hearings are formal proceedings publicized through a special public notice issued to media and others. Public hearings held by the board are to provide the board an opportunity to hear from the public about a specific topic. Public hearings are therefore different regarding audience participation at board meetings.
- Commissioners shall be addressed by their title followed by their last name.
- Commissioners shall obtain approval from the chair before speaking or asking questions of staff, presenters, and public. As a courtesy, the chair shall allow an opportunity, by the commissioner who has the floor, to ask immediate follow-up questions.
- A majority of the board shall constitute a quorum and be necessary for the transaction of business.
- All board meeting notices are publicized in accordance with public meeting laws.
- All board meetings shall commence with the Pledge of Allegiance.
- The chair will utilize the gavel as needed to maintain order, commence and adjourn meetings, and signal approval of motions.
- The board reserves the right to recess to executive session as may be required at any time during these meetings, pursuant to ORS 192.660(1).
- The courthouse is accessible to persons with disabilities. If special accommodations are needed for persons with hearing visual, or manual impairments who wish to participate in the meeting, contact (503) 842-3403 at least 24 hours prior to the meeting so that the appropriate communications assistance can be arranged.

PUBLIC COMMENT

- Providing public comment is an opportunity for constituents to be heard and express their views to the board.
- The board allows public comment at board meetings during the public comment period designated on the agenda.
- Comments are limited to one per person and per agenda item.
- Comments must be related to the agenda item(s) previously registered to comment on.
- The allotted time for public comments is two minutes per person; this time may not be allotted to another speaker. The chair may, at their sole discretion, further limit or expand the amount of time.
- The public comment opportunity is not a discussion, debate, or dialogue between the speaker and the board, which may or may not respond.
- Members of the public do not have the right to disrupt the meeting; the board may prohibit demonstrations such as booing, hissing, or clapping.
- Remarks containing hate speech, profanity, obscenity, name calling or personal attacks, defamation to a person, people, or organization, or other remarks the board deems inappropriate will not be allowed.
- Failure to follow all rules and procedures may result in not being able to provide public comment and/or being removed from the meeting.

In-Person Procedures

Sign in before the meeting begins and indicate your desire to provide public comment and which agenda
item you would like to comment on. When your name is announced, please come forward to the table
placed in front of the dais and for the record, first identify yourself, area of residence, and organization
represented, if any.

Virtual Procedures

- Register by sending an email to publiccomments@co.tillamook.or.us. by 12:00 p.m. on the Tuesday prior to the board meeting. The email must contain all of the following information:
 - o Full name, area of residence, and phone number.
 - o Agenda item(s), you wish to comment on.
- Once registered, and before the start of the meeting, board staff will email a Microsoft Teams meeting link.
- When logged in to the meeting you must remain muted with your camera off until your name is called, then you unmute and turn on your camera.
- The chair may require those providing virtual comment to turn on their camera while providing comment or testimony.

The Tillamook County Board of Commissioners is pleased to provide this letter of support to the City of Garibaldi for their application to become a "Coast Guard City." The services of the men and women of the Coast Guard are critical to those who live and recreate in the waters off this small fishing village on the north Oregon coast. Garibaldi has and continues to make special efforts to acknowledge the professional work of the Coast Guard men and women, and to make this area feel like their "home away from home."

During the past year Garibaldi has held several events specifically to recognize the important work of the Coast Guard men and women who have served here over the years. They kicked off the year with the Pat Patterson Day Celebration honoring Mr. Patterson's WWII service here in the Coast Guard. The event was held for the first time on March 7th of 2022 at the historic US Coast Guard Boathouse and will now be an annual event honoring a new "Sailor of the Year" each year.

Garibaldi is home to the Garibaldi Maritime Museum where a display commemorates the history and importance of the US Coast Guard to the area. Each year new information will be added to the display that highlights the newly selected "Sailor of the Year."

While Garibaldi is a small town compared to many other cities with this honorable designation, they have a big heart for the Coast Guard men and women and their families. This year they hosted their annual Coast Guard Appreciation Day where all city residents were invited to come out and enjoy fun family activities, live music and local cuisine. Almost 300 people (from a population of 870) came out to celebrate and appreciate the Coast Guard.

Each year during the annual Garibaldi Days Celebration, the Coast Guard participates in the parade and a friendly water fight with the Garibaldi Fire Department. The Coast Guard is an integral part of this community, and the City of Garibaldi works hard to ensure they know how much they are appreciated!

The Tillamook County Commissioners hope that the committee will find that the City of Garibaldi is worthy of the honorable designation of "Coast Guard City."

Discussion of Land Use Program & Kiwanda Corridor Project

The Board of County Commissioners adopted the Kiwanda Corridor Project Preferred Concept on August 31, 2022. The project area spans from Cape Kiwanda and the County owned property east of Circle Drive south to Bob Straub State Park. Development proposals include development of a new County campground, a new parking lot, multi-modal paths, maintenance of access to the beach, development of a public park on the Jensen property as well as parking lot improvements to the Cape Kiwanda Parking Lot together with construction of new facility improvements to enhance the recreational and scenic values of the Cape Kiwanda area.

The Kiwanda Corridor is comprised of several zoning districts and a diverse range of existing uses. The Department has identified several areas within the corridor project where established uses of properties may be better supported by an alternative zoning designation. There are also many areas within the Kiwanda Corridor Project area that are under-developed based upon the development potential afforded by existing zoning designations. With the adoption of this new plan, opportunity is presented to commence a long-range planning effort to better align zoning designations and districts in relation to the projects identified in the Kiwanda Corridor Project Preferred Concept and to re-evaluate the location of existing zoning designations and districts in relation to existing and future development of properties within this area of the Pacific City/Woods Unincorporated Community.

The Department requests the Board of County Commissioners concur this is the appropriate time for "next steps" in continuation of the County's adoption of the Kiwanda Corridor Project Preferred Concept to fully realize the visioning completed by the County's efforts in responding to the needs of this highly sought area of Pacific City/Woods, and to utilize this long-range planning process as an opportunity to address any other community needs that may also be identified during the long-range planning process.

Next Steps if Authorization is Granted

The Department will hold a stakeholder meeting with property owners who own property within the Kiwanda Corridor, Rachel Hagerty, Chief of Staff, Chris Laity, Public Works Director, JoAnn Woelfle, Parks Director, and other state agencies who may have a regulatory interest in development activities within the Kiwanda Corridor Project area.

Should authorization be granted, long-range planning efforts will begin with focus on consideration of zoning and land use ordinance amendments to further support development within the Kiwanda Corridor Project area. Commencement of these long-range planning efforts would be November 2022.

Draft zoning and land use ordinance amendments would be presented to the Pacific City/Woods CAC for comment followed by two public hearings in Spring 2023 held by the Tillamook County Planning Commission to consider the proposed amendments. The Tillamook County Planning Commission will ultimately make recommendations to the Board of County Commissioners for action on the recommended amendments in Summer 2023. The Board of County Commissioners would take this matter up at a public hearing to consider adoption of the proposed amendments.

Project timeline completion is estimated to take approximately 8 months from a start date of November 2022.


