 about a specific topic. Public hearings are therefore different regarding audience participation at board
 meetings.
- Commissioners shall be addressed by their title followed by their last name.
- Commissioners shall obtain approval from the chair before speaking or asking questions of staff, presenters, and public. As a courtesy, the chair shall allow an opportunity, by the commissioner who has the floor, to ask immediate follow-up questions.
- A majority of the board shall constitute a quorum and be necessary for the transaction of business.
- All board meeting notices are publicized in accordance with public meeting laws.
- All board meetings shall commence with the Pledge of Allegiance.
- The chair will utilize the gavel as needed to maintain order, commence and adjourn meetings, and signal approval of motions.
- The board reserves the right to recess to executive session as may be required at any time during these meetings, pursuant to ORS 192.660(1).
- The courthouse is accessible to persons with disabilities. If special accommodations are needed for persons with hearing visual, or manual impairments who wish to participate in the meeting, contact (503) 842-3403 at least 24 hours prior to the meeting so that the appropriate communications assistance can be arranged.

PUBLIC COMMENT

- Providing public comment is an opportunity for constituents to be heard and express their views to the board.

- Comments must be related to the agenda item(s) previously registered to comment on.

- The public comment opportunity is not a discussion, debate, or dialogue between the speaker and the board, which may or may not respond.
- Members of the public do not have the right to disrupt the meeting; the board may prohibit demonstrations such as booing, hissing, or clapping.
- Remarks containing hate speech, profanity, obscenity, name calling or personal attacks, defamation to a person, people, or organization, or other remarks the board deems inappropriate will not be allowed.
- Failure to follow all rules and procedures may result in not being able to provide public comment and/or being removed from the meeting.

Dear ATV Committee Members:

The Tillamook County Board of Commissioners wish to express support for Oregon State Parks and Recreation Off Highway Vehicle (OHV) grant funding to procure new equipment for the safe operations at the Sand Lake Recreation Area.

Sand Lake Recreation Area is a premier OHV dune riding area in Northwest Oregon which draws OHV riders from all over Oregon and Washington. These individuals come to Sand Lake to enjoy camping and OHV recreation in a safe environment along the Pacific Coast. Sand Lake has three developed campgrounds, a dispersed camping area, and a day use staging area that allow access the sand dunes and beach. Law Enforcement and initial emergency response to incidents is provided by the Tillamook County Sheriff's Office (TCSO) and USFS Law Enforcement personnel.

The TCSO and USFS work cooperatively often conducting joint patrols and sharing equipment. In addition to law enforcement contacts, officers responded to numerous recreational accidents providing initial triage at the scene and guiding in emergency medical services. A majority of these contacts and emergency responses are conducted while patrolling on ATVs because these machines allow officers to ride through confined camping and wooded areas where traditional patrol trucks will not fit or simply cannot go due to conditions of the sand.

Oregon's ATV grant program has been invaluable in helping USFS manage the complex and challenging OHV program. The maintenance, education, and law enforcement work done each year keeps these areas open and safe for families and visitors to enjoy.

This project will be a first step in building the Salmonberry Trail, an 87-mile route along the former Pacific Railroad & Navigation line between Banks and Tillamook. This historic railroad traverses many of northwest Oregon's most scenic and special landscapes, including rivers, canyons, valleys, and coastlines.

Similar to the interconnected landscapes, the project relies on partnerships to succeed. Among the entities collaborating on this project are the City of Bay City, the Port of Garibaldi, Port of Tillamook Bay, the Salmonberry Trail Foundation, the Oregon Coast Scenic Railroad, Kilchis Point Reserve, and many others. The knowledge gained through this process will guide and advance future trail development.

The Board of Commissioners, like many others in our community, recognize the value of providing safe modes of travel for residents and visitors alike. Building the Kilchis Point Path, and ultimately the Salmonberry Trail, will create a safe alternative to Highway 101. We are invested and committed to the success of this project for the health of our community.

Tillamook Board of Commissioners of Tillamook County,

I am pleased to see that our county still thinks it is a priority to "reducing tobacco use" despite its full embrace of harmful substances. I find it interesting that the county in this agreement is concerned with vaping and E-cigarettes but does not seem concerned with harmful effects of smoking marijuana, especially as concerning minors.

I would like the commissioners to give the citizens of Tillamook County more information about this tobacco program. While I realize \$10,000 is not a large amount of funds for counties, the fact remains these funds will not go to other programs that citizens would prioritize higher, such as law enforcement and roads. This is especially true considering that the all of the current commissioners frequently lament that there is not enough funding for these most important priorities to the citizens of this county.

Here are some questions:

- Concerning "shared strategies in this agreement," does this include tobacco with less
 nicotine? Cigarette papers so smokers can roll their own? Inhalers for subsequent asthma that
 may ensue from smoking?
 I ask because the county thinks it beneficial to provide heroin users with needles, so these
 supplies seem fitting for a similar tobacco prevention program.
- 2. Is there a particular reason this agreement singles out "Latino/a/x" persons as a population to be targeted? Are you more concerned with the damage smoking can do toward this community than the black community? Are there no "whites" that struggle with tobacco use in our county?
- 3. Why do you think it is to the tax payer's benefit to have another employee (or advisory committee person) sit in bi-weekly meetings that have little to do with the governance or the priorities of well being in our county? Isn't there a better way to utilize the county's use of employee time, given that the county claims to be understaffed?

By and large, tobacco use has significantly decreased in our country. E-cigarettes and vaping are not the best health choice, but are far less harmful than obesity and overuse of medications. However, as far as many of your constituents are concerned crime, road conditions, and drugs/homelessness/mental health should be the focus of your attentions.

In the June 2022 meeting minutes and at the 12/19/22 EDC Board Meeting, Commissioner Bell and the Economic Development Council said their primary purpose for proposing a Rural Business License (Ordinance #88) was because they had no other way to get "a list" of businesses, as a matter of emergency. At the 12/19 EDC Board Meeting, when angry business owners asked why the EDC didn't get the list from the state, Commissioner Bell replied that the website only allowed you to look up one business at a time, and that it was impossible to get a list that way.

However, it only took us one week to email the Secretary of State and get the list. The list that inspired the County to raise \$100,000 off the backs of a few hundred local businesses is in fact public information, maintained by the Secretary of State and available for free upon request. We are in possession of the list ourselves.

Not only that, the representative we spoke to at the Secretary of State (SoS) is now very concerned that the County was unable to get these public records:

- Was the County/EDC denied access to public records by someone at the SoS? If so, the SoS wants to start an investigation.
- Or did the County/EDC never ask for the public records? If so, it is either incompetent or is liable for making misrepresentations to the public.

To get this straight: in over 20 years of economic development, the EDC never asked the Secretary of State for a list of businesses, nor established their own through research and community outreach.

It is clear that the EDC has become obsolete. It's not doing its own job, it does not provide value to businesses. This is self-evident by the lack of businesses who are willing to become paid members: even well-funded logging businesses have canceled their memberships.

We represent a group of Rural Tillamook Businesses who are calling for the dissolution of the EDC if it cannot fund itself and the end of the rural business license idea. Economic development should be supporting local businesses, not shutting them down.
