TILLAMOOK SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 9 TILLAMOOK COUNTY, OREGON

CAPTION:

Tillamook School Bonds to Access Match for Safety/Facility Improvements

QUESTION:

Shall the District issue up to \$23,535,000 in bonds and receive \$6,000,000 in State grant for safety and facility improvements? If the bonds are approved, they will be payable from taxes on property or property ownership that are not subject to the limits of sections 11 and 11b, Article XI of the Oregon Constitution.

SUMMARY:

State Matching Grant:

If bonds are approved, the State will provide a \$6,000,000 matching grant to the Tillamook School District.

Cost:

Bonds may be issued in series; each maturing within 21 years from issuance. Due to retirement of existing bonds, estimated annual tax rate is not expected to increase above District's current bond levy rate of \$0.69 per \$1,000 of assessed value. Actual levy rate may differ due to final interest rates, changes in assessed value.

Improvements:

Bonds will finance capital costs at various District facilities that include:

- Enhanced safety, security, and accessibility.
- Improved parking areas and bus lanes.
- Added classroom and education spaces, cafeteria expansion, and library enhancements.
- Student wellness and athletic facility improvements.
- Additional playground equipment and structures.
- Replacement of heating/ventilation units.
- Replacement of underground fuel tanks and gas pumps.

- General	property	improvements	such	as	fencing,	signage,	restrooms,	roofing,	carpeting,	and
lighting.										

Bonds will also finance demolition, furnishings, equipment, interest, and bond issuance costs.

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
